2020/2021 OUTCOMES

- Participated in Regional Emergency Management and closure of facilities
- Fiscal efficiency, "Clean" 2020 audit with surplus transferred to Capital
- Balanced 2021 operating and capital budgets with no municipal tax increase
- Managed wastewater, including system operation and emergency provisions
- Completion of most of the Roadway upgrades
- Promotion of a range of good environmental practices (run-off control, fertilizer/herbicides/pesticides bans), leadership to the "Watershed Management Plan" implementation and in-lake science obtained grant for scientific buoy
