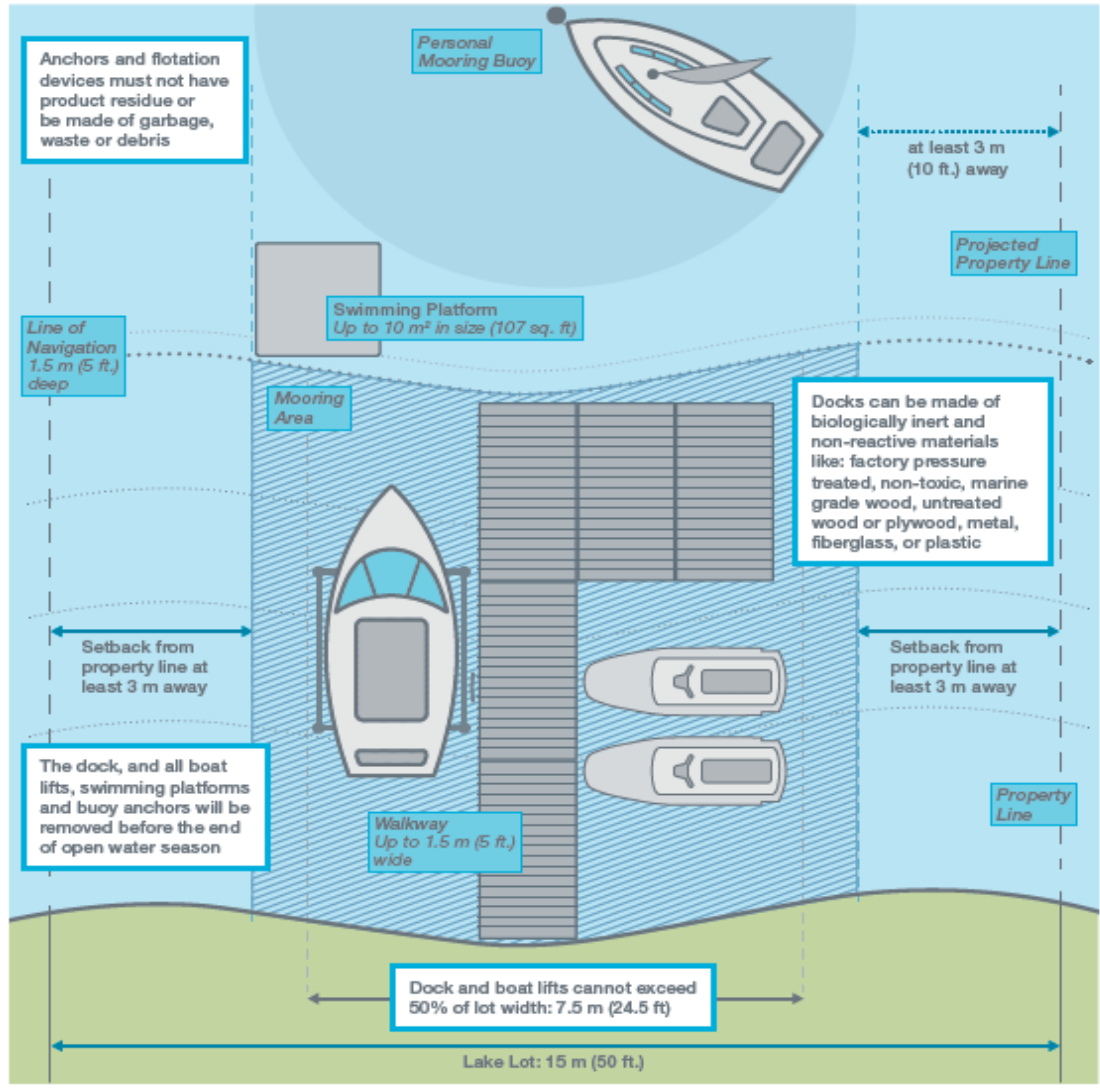

Boat Mooring Guidelines & Requirements



OVERVIEW

As of 2021, the Alberta Government has new requirements for placing docks and mooring structures in Alberta Lakes. This brochure outlines the requirements and process for residents to place a temporary, seasonal dock for personal recreational use.

WHAT YOU NEED TO DO...

- 1) Examine the “Moorage allowance infographic” located overleaf.
- 2) Assess if your moorage plan is entirely consistent with the dimensions in that “infographic”
- 3) If your property is on the water and your dock, lift and other structures meet all of the standards in that graphic, **no further action is required.**

- 4) If your dock or other structures deviate from the “infographic” you’re require to apply for Municipal approval and a provincial government “Temporary Field Authorization” (TFA)

NOTE: Please be cautious: The most common infraction is the placement of equipment within 3m of your neighbour

- 5) If your dock or other structures are to be placed in the water adjacent to municipal property (parks and reserves), one person needs to obtain approval from the Summer Village.

- 6) All equipment in front of Municipal property once approved, must be **clearly marked as per ownership.**

The enforcement of standards is by Alberta Environment who have authority to confiscate & dispose of violating docks, lifts, and boats, if equipment is unregistered or unmarked.

OBTAINING MUNICIPAL APPROVAL:

- If your equipment is on Municipal property OR if you require a TFA for a deviation, you will require Municipal approval. Obtain the Boat Mooring form at <https://crystalsprings.ca/Policies/> and email to information@svofficepl.com or mail to Box 100, Ma-Me-O Beach, AB T0C 1X0

OBTAINING A PROVINCIAL TFA:

- If you require a TFA you will need to obtain Municipal approval first, followed by a provincial ID and then apply for a TFA. For detailed directions go to <https://open.alberta.ca/publications/plar-approvals-and-authorizations-administrative-procedures>
